MAINTENANCE AND CARE

Oak is a beautiful and strong type of wood with a lovely natural grain. Like any natural material, the colour of oak wood will change slightly over time. Exposure to direct sunlight can fasten this process. To prevent colour differences, it's suggested to move objects placed on the furniture from time to time.

Our varnished tables are finished with a water-based lacquer for the protection of the wood which has a good chemical and mechanical resistance.

Regular cleaning with a mild solution of water and natural soap will do the trick!

Please do not sand varnished furniture, as this will damage the protective layer and will thus affect the water and dirt resistance of your furniture.

We would also strongly suggest avoiding exposure to extreme temperatures or temperature fluctuations, as this can cause wood to start moving. Using placemats to prevent hot pots, pans and cold glasses or bottles from leaving marks on the furniture is an excellent idea.
